Please remember:

For our courses and events, we often offer food, limited spaces, or have a special guest that we pay for. We ask that if you are not able to attend, you inform us well in advance so we can adjust, and possibly others can take your spot.

Insurances in Norway

In Norway, you can decide yourself what type of private insurances you need. While the public healthcare system covers most medical expenses, many have private insurance for additional coverage.
It is strongly recommended to have a home content insurance. This will insure your personal belongings in your home (in case of theft, fire, water leakage or similar, also if you get displaced due to one of these issues).
You can purchase insurance through UiB trade union <u>Trade unions at UiB | Employee Pages | UiB</u> that usually offers a discount, directly from an insurance company, or through your bank. As a state employee and a member of Statens Pensjonskasse (SPK), you may have specific insurance options available through SPK, so it's worth exploring these as well.

Things to do in Bergen

1. Explore Bryggen: Wander through the historic Bryggen area with its narrow alleys and wooden houses. This UNESCO World Heritage site offers a glimpse into Bergen's medieval past. Enjoy a coffee at an outdoor café while admiring the sunlit buildings and Mount Ulriken in the backdrop. Visit the Hanseatic, Bryggen, and Theta Museums for deeper historical insights.

2. Visit the Fish Market: Located in the heart of Bergen, the Fish Market has been a bustling hub since the 1200s. From May to October, savor freshly cooked seafood at outdoor dining spots. Don't miss the market's vibrant atmosphere and the unique flavors of the Norwegian coast.

3. Ascend to the Mountains: Take the Fløibanen funicular up to Mount Fløyen for stunning views and outdoor activities. Enjoy the playground, picnic areas, and the historic Fløien Folkerestaurant. For a longer hike, trek from Fløyen to Mount Ulriken, or take the Ulriken cable car for breathtaking panoramas.

4. Walk Through Bergen: Discover Bergen's compact city center on foot. Explore narrow streets and wooden buildings, shopping areas like Torgalmenningen, and the Nordnes peninsula with its charming boutiques and cafes. Visit Nordnesparken and Bergen Aquarium for family-friendly fun.

5. Enjoy Outdoor Dining: On sunny days, dine al fresco at various locations including Bryggen, the Fish Market, and USF Verftet. For a unique experience, take a boat to Cornelius Sjømatrestaurant on Holmen for a seafood meal by the sea.

6. Kayak Through History: Paddle through the historic waters near the Norwegian Museum of Fisheries. Borrow a kayak to enjoy the scenery and help keep the harbor clean by collecting rubbish.

7. See Bergen from the Sea: Board the "First Player" sailboat for a guided tour of Bergen from the water. Alternatively, take the Heritage Mini Cruise to the Norwegian Fisheries Museum for a shorter adventure.

8. Visit Troldhaugen: Explore the Edvard Grieg Museum Troldhaugen, the former home of the famous composer. The site includes Grieg's villa, composer cabin, and concert hall. Enjoy concerts and learn about Grieg's life and music.

9. Experience Old Bergen Museum: Step back in time at Old Bergen Museum, a reconstructed wooden town from the 1800s. Actors in period costumes bring history to life. During summer, enjoy family activities and swim at nearby Sandviken Sjøbad.

10. Discover Lysøen: Visit Lysøen island and Ole Bull's Villa. Enjoy beautiful nature trails, unique architecture, and historical insights into the life of the famous violinist. Swim at the island's beaches if you're brave enough for the cold water.

11. Klatreparken Høyt & Lavt Bergen: Just south of Bergen, this climbing park offers ziplines and trails for all ages. Perfect for an adventurous family outing.

12. Byfjellene Hikes: Explore Bergen's city mountains like Fløyen and Ulriken. For an extended adventure, hike Løvstakken and Lyderhorn for breathtaking views.

13. Nordnes Sjøbad: Enjoy a heated pool and sunbathing at this central outdoor pool in Nordnesparken. It's a popular spot on sunny days.

14. Stoltzekleiven: Challenge yourself with a steep hike up Stoltzekleiven. The ascent is tough, but the views and sense of accomplishment are worth it.

15. Zipline at Ulriken: Experience Norway's fastest zipline on Mount Ulriken. It's an exhilarating way to see Bergen's highest mountain.

16. RIB Safari: For a thrilling adventure, try a RIB safari. These high-speed boat tours offer a unique way to explore the fjords and coastal landscape.
